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Abstract The authors examined the effects of a 12-week, 100% body weight (BW) resistance training program on the body composition and muscle strength of 10 sedentary, middle-aged men. The results showed that the program significantly increased muscle strength and body composition, with no significant changes in body weight or body fat percentage. The authors concluded that a 12-week, 100% BW resistance training program is an effective way to improve muscle strength and body composition in sedentary, middle-aged men.
